No upsets in the opening round of the Winchester Invitational Tournament. It's the first time there has been no upset in the opening round here since 2015. There were just three upsets in the entire tournament that year. Porta/AC won the tournament title.

Triopia's Shawn Bell now has 151 career points at the Winchester Invitational Tournament. He had 20 Saturday, and needs just 8 points to move into the top 50 scorers of all time.

Three teams scored 70 or more in the first round Saturday. Calhoun had 76, Payson 74 and West Central 74. It was the first time since 2006 that three teams scored at least 70 points in the first round.

Triopia stopped Calhoun in the tournament two years ago 68-65 on the Trojans' way to the tournament title. Calhoun last won over Triopia here in the first round of the 2016 tournament.

Porta/AC beat Camp Point in the 2014 and 2015 tournaments. The Bluejays beat Central in the third place game in 2015, and won in the first round in 2015. The last win by Camp Point over Porta/AC was in 2005 when Porta fell 54-48 in the consolation title game that year.

Todd Bradshaw of Griggsville Perry is quietly sneaking up the career coaching lists at Winchester. Bradshaw has now coached 59 games in the tournament. That's one short of the legendary Dick Hamann of Carrollton. If Bradshaw can pull an upset this week, it would be win number 33, two short of Dan Bowman on the career list. And, Bradshaw is in his 17<sup>th</sup> year of coaching at Griggsville Perry, as a result of two stints there. He is tied with Bob Hembrough of Beardstown for the 5<sup>th</sup> spot all time. He is two behind Jeff Abell of Bluffs and West Central.
